Basics of Catholicism part 13

Revelation as faith

The topics of faith and God only makes sense because of revelation. The Greek understanding of the word "revelation" adds many layers of depth to the meaning of this word: unveiling, making known, to reveal. When we talk of "God's revelation," we mean that God has unveiled or made known to us something about the mystery of who he is or about the world. Revelation is a necessary part of the Christian faith and faith in general as it gives us insights into realities beyond us, namely, the mystery of God.

The entire topic of revelation revolves around one central tenant of faith: God wants to be known. Imagine that we have a "clockmaker god" who created the universe and then watches as it unfolds. He has no desire to integrate with his world nor does he want to take any part of it. Would we know of his existence? Yes, the universe came from somewhere. Could we understand anything about him? Yes, throughout reason alone we could deduce several ideas: God as one, God as all-powerful, and God as all-knowing. Largely the list ends here. Without something more from this mechanically oriented god, we cannot know anything more. Revelation implies that God wants to be made known. Thus God is a god who wants to interact with his creation; he wants his creation to know him; he takes an active part in his creation; he allows himself to be made known. Without God wanting to be known and making himself known, both revelation and faith would not be possible.

A good amount of our knowledge of God comes through revelation. God relating to us as male, God as all-loving, God as desiring a relationship with humanity, God as father, and God as merciful are from revelation alone. Yet revelation poses many challenges. We cannot replicate our knowledge of God like a scientist running an experiment. We cannot point to the reality of God and allow everyone to experience it. Much of revelation feels like it is hidden within a personal experience. This is simply not true. The revelation of God is a revelation to the world. Next week we will cover the challenges and solutions to revelation.






Catholic Radio Station Announcement:


