

Did You Know!

Although our Paschal Candle is usually hidden in the back corner, this candle is one of the great symbols of Easter. The light of the candle that illumines the darkness reminds that Jesus' Resurrection cast out the darkness of this world. The Paschal Candle is blessed during, and only during, the Easter Vigil. The blessing involves several steps. The first step is to mark the candle with the five wounds of Jesus corresponding to the five points of the cross (one being in the middle), then the alpha (Greek letter A), the omega (the Greek letter W or the last letter), and the year the candle is blessed. All of these are symbols of

Christ. The five points – five wounds on the Cross, the A and W – the beginning and the end, the year reminds us that God comes in time at this specific moment of time. The candle is then lit with the Easter Fire and solemnly processed in to illumine the dark church. The candle is blessed during the baptismal rite when it is dunked in the Baptismal font three times to symbol new life coming from the font and the breaking of the seal on the font. The Paschal Candle is used during the Easter Season, for baptisms, and for funerals. All moments that recall the Resurrection.

Happy Easter!

The lack of information regarding Jesus rising from the dead struck me. No one was at the tomb when he came back to life and rose from the bonds of death. Yet, Mary of Magdala saw the empty tomb so did Peter, James, and John. How did Jesus untie himself? Like Lazarus who came out of the tomb bound by cloth and Jesus commanded the people to untie him, no one was there to untie Jesus but the angels. Regardless, the burial cloths were still in the tomb neatly folded and in their own places. No one was there when the tomb was opened and the huge stone rolled away. Yet, everyone saw that the stone had been rolled away. This central mystery of our faith is shrouded in unknowns. Does this mean that the Resurrection didn't happen?

Of course not. Jesus proved that the Resurrection happened through a series of events that become the core of the Easter Season. He appeared to Mary of Magdala at the tomb shrouded in his new life so that she may know that it was truly Jesus. The Resurrection changed his appearance so that we may know that he didn't wake from a coma or happened to fake his death. He was slightly different. He appeared to the disciples in the upper room and on the shore of the Sea of Galilee where he ate fish, talked with them, and allowed them to touch him so that they may know that he is a physical human being and not a ghost. Finally, he continues to inspire people throughout history by coming to each of us individually that we may know his power in our lives and believe that he truly lives.

As the Easter Season dawns, I encourage you to pray with the mystery of the Resurrection. Ponder anew its events either through reading them in the Bible or thinking through their details. God wants us to know that we can have enteral life with him, he wants us to know that we too can rise from the dead like Jesus, he wants us to know that he loves us and calls us to new life in him, and he wants us to glorify and praise him in these strange and important parts of our faith. Let God inspire a renewed faith during this Season of Joy. Let him visit you and prove to you the new life of the Resurrection. May he make your faith firmer and guide you to new life with him.


