
Pray for our Seminarians

Did You Know!

The Season of Lent was added during the 4th century to accommodate the huge influx of people who wanted to join the church. Before 313, a person who wanted to join the Church could wait up to 10 years to enter the Church. The formal process took between 2 to 6 years to ensure that the person was ready to make this decision, willing to accept the challenges that come with Christianity, and wouldn't turn the Christians into the Roman government. The process was shorted to 40 days following the Edict of Constantine which became the Season of Lent. The process was expanded to 9 months in the 20^{tn} century to better prepare people for the Christian life.

Holy Cross recommends that the following be respected:

Christian Burial: Notice should be made with the priest before arrangements are made with the funeral director.

Basics of Catholicism part 26:

The Liturgical Year: Living Jesus' Life

As we are about to enter into some of the most important church seasons of the year, I want to take the next several parts of this series to express the importance and value of the church year, the seasons, the feasts, and help you celebrate the life of Jesus. Most of you are aware of the seasons of the year, or at least Christmas and Easter. We celebrate these seasons with a varying levels of décor and joy. Yet, these seasons and the church yearly cycle have a point: to celebrate the life of Jesus. Through the course of one year, we will celebrate all the major events in Jesus' life. We start with Advent and the prophesies that announced the birth of the Messiah. Then Christmas with the joy of his birth and God becoming Man. As we enter Lent we begin a time of preparation and special focus on the central events in the life of faith. The year reaches a high point with the Easter season celebrating Jesus' Resurrection and the birth of the Church. Although these seasons grab our attention and help us focus on the most central events of Jesus' life, the rest of the year is full of the same focus and drive. Throughout these next several parts of this series I want to help you explore the seasons, know the different feasts, and find joy in our liturgical calendar.

Celebrating the Life of Jesus

The church year cycles around the central events of the life of Jesus. Although we could have a thirty-year or three-year cycle, we don't. Every event in the life of Jesus is celebrated each year. If the cycle was too long, we would forget these central events that led to our salvation. If the cycle was too short, we would miss parts of the life of Jesus. A one-year cycle encompasses all the major events while meshing with our solar seasons and solar calendar.

The main events of the year are the easiest to understand: Christmas and Easter. Some people only experience these two events in the life of Jesus. Christmas reminds us that Jesus, God made man, out of his great love for us, came to dwell with his creation. Easter reminds us of the reason why he came: to free us from sin and death and to bring us into the life of God. These two central feasts become the hinge points of our year and the celebrations through which the rest of the year makes sense. The rest of the year fills in the story. On each of the Sundays of Ordinary Time, we read another event in the life of Jesus from one of the Gospels so that each Sunday becomes a chance to enter into his life. The other pivotal seasons prepare us to understand the mysteries of Christmas and Easter. The Church in her wisdom created these cycles so that we continually keep in mind the events of Jesus' life, reflect upon them, find spiritual and practical wisdom for our life, and follow Jesus in our daily living.




Book Sale: Karen Simonich is hosting a book sale on the 1st Sunday of each month. You are welcome to look through them and see if you are interested in any of them


