Free Speech

The media presents freedom of speech as one of the most challenged rights of our current era. Any of us can name a series of people who all challenged the nation with the question about our freedom of speech. The Church also holds the value and importance of the freedom of speech. Many argue that the Church prefers to silence and suppress than to give freedoms. This is not true. If you were to research the history of the Church and the many times that controversies arose, a pattern would emerge. The first part of the pattern is that the Church listens to this new voice with a critical ear. Second, the new viewpoint is debated and discussed. Third, the Church then presents the findings and the truth of our beliefs. After all these steps, the false teaching is then suppressed to favor the truth.

This simple example of the way the church deals with dissenting or differing voices isolates the true value of the freedom of speech. Often we think of the freedom of speech as the ability to say whatever we want whenever we want. This idea degrades our human dignity. Following through with this idea means that I can say whatever mean thoughts come to mind, whatever degrading ideas I feel, preach whatever false statements I want. Basically, an unbounded freedom of speech degrades our society and causes a great disruption in the quest for truth. The good of the freedom of speech is that it allows all people to seek the truth. It gives us the freedom to speak in such a way that we can dissent but ultimately work towards the good for all people. With the freedom of speech we should be able to call out mean speech, degrading comments, and false ideas so that all people can know the truth and work towards it.

I encourage all people to examine their own patterns of speech. In what ways do we encourage mean or hate speech through the ways we talk about people, share information, or speak about others? In what ways do we hold to ideas with no basis in facts or reason? How often do we promote false ideas and hold firm on them when corrected? How willing are we to be corrected and shown the truth? The answers to these questions will show the value of the freedom of speech in our own lives.




## Congratulations to WOF Scholarship Winners
