

Basics of Catholicism part 100

The Rite of Ordination of a Deacon: Symbols

The symbols of the deacon, which represent his role, are made more obvious in the final parts of the Rite of Ordination. Now ordained and vested in the vestments of a deacon, he proceeds to the bishop's chair where the bishop hands him the Book of the Gospels. The proclaiming of the Gospel as well as preaching the Word are two of the main roles of the deacon. The words the bishop charges the new deacon with I find rather beautiful. He says: "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you have become, believe what you read, teach what you believe, practice what you teach." The Gospel is being handed down to this deacon not as a sign of faith but as a command to teach and preach. One of the roles of the deacon is to preach at Mass. More specifically the proper role of the deacon at Mass is to proclaim the Gospel. Whenever a deacon is present at Mass, he has primacy in proclaiming the Gospel even above a priest or bishop.

Following the handing on of the Gospel, the bishop exchanges a sign of peace with the newly ordained and all the deacons follow.

The next symbols of the deacon are far less obvious. Now the newly ordained takes his appropriate seat in the Sanctuary right next to the bishop. In the liturgy, the deacon is one of the primary assistants to the bishop, not priests. The deacon now takes on several roles. If this was not an ordination, the deacon would have started the Penitential Act, asked for the presider (priest's or bishop's) blessing before proclaiming the Gospel, and read the prayers of the faithful.

Now that Rite has concluded, we continue with the Eucharistic Prayer. The proper role of the deacon is to prepare for the Eucharist. If he is not present, a server sets up the altar. If no server, then the priest. So, the deacon sets up the altar and performs two actions specific to the deacon. He mixed the water and the wine. Then he hands the paten with the bread to the celebrant of the Mass. These two roles are expected of the deacon. Next he hands the chalice to the presider. His role is one of service to the Mass and assistant to the priest.

During the Eucharistic Prayer, the deacon kneels only during the Prayer of Consecration. In contrast, the people kneel from the Holy, Holy, Holy until the Great Amen, the entire Eucharistic Prayer. During the elevation at the Great Amen, the deacon elevates the chalice. The deacon is the proper minister of the chalice. Which means several things. First, he is the one to elevate it at the Great Amen. His proper role is to distribute the Blood of Christ during the Mass. Lastly,

he can purify the chalices at the conclusion of communion. These are his proper roles.
