## Gifts of the Holy Spirit

## The Gift of Piety

Often we connect the gift of piety to the action of piety. Hence we see a person being reverent in the church, dutiful in prayer, or acting in a manner that we think matches holiness and assume the person is pious or has the gift of piety. This may not be the case. A person can act pious without expressing the virtue of piety. Namely, they live the actions of piety without the interior disposition towards piety, i.e. put on a show of piety. In the same way a person can be pious without the gift of piety. Through our own actions we can learn and choose to love God and show that through our actions. We can determine that certain actions are more suitable for a church, for prayer, or for Mass through our own reasoning. This is not the spiritual gift of piety. The gift of piety is an infused sense by the Holy Spirit of a reverence for holy things. A person with the gift of piety will automatically understand the proper disposition in a sacred place, for sacred actions, or the proper reverence due to God.

The gift of piety bestows upon the person certain gifts. First, filial respect for God as a loving Father. Second, a generous and childlike love, so that a person wants to please God, even if it means making sacrifices. Third, a loving obedience toward the teachings of God and his Church and commandments, respecting them as expressions of God's love for us. A person with the gift of piety recognizes the many different aspects of God's relationship and revelation to us as expressions of his love and cherishes them in his/her heart. Piety builds a reverence for all things of God.

Holy Spirit, through whom we have received the right to call God by the sweet name of Father and to be truly his children, help us in our endeavor to become ever less unworthy of having so good and merciful a Father. May we, after loving him with all our hearts in this world, through you, glorify him eternally in his only Son.

# Have A Seat!

Catholic Extension is giving us a \$30,000 grant to help get new pews. There is one catch. We must match the money \$2 for every \$1 they give us. Basically we need to raise \$60,000 by Dec. 31, 2023. This may seem like a daunting or difficult task. We have already raised \$20,546 of it through donations that came after the grant was submitted. We received a generous donation of \$30,000 before the grant was submitted. If we raise the requisite \$60,000, then we will reach our goal of \$125,000. I ask you to be generous and help us get this incredible grant. If each

household donates \$500 by Dec. 31 to the pews, then the project is set to be completed next summer. Know that I am pledging my \$500 to this project. Thank you for your generosity.
