I encourage everyone to spend some time researching the persecutions on the church and coming to understand and realize the strength of our brothers and sisters who paved the way for our faith and died for the sake of Christ.

The Holy Spirit

Inspired by the Feast of Pentecost and with hope for the good of this parish, the church, and all of you, I want to take the next several weeks to reflect on the Holy Spirit and the gifts of the Spirit. I feel the Holy Spirit is often ignored or little emphasis is placed on the importance of the Holy Spirit in our lives. We know of God the Father as the Almighty, the Father of Jesus, and sometimes refer to him simply as "God." Jesus is the most relatable of the three persons of the Trinity as the one who became human, the one who took away our sins, and the one who has eyes and ears like us. But who is the Holy Spirit? Is he a ghost like so many from ages past seemed to assume? Is he just another aspect of God? How do we relate to the Spirit?

We must be clear on one point: the Spirit is God just like the Father and the Son. He is one of the three persons of the Trinity and the one who links the relationship of the Father and Son together often referred to as the "bond of love shared by the Father and the Son." I don't want to reduce the Spirit to simply an idea or a theological point. The Spirit is profoundly important in our daily lives. God sent his Spirit into each human being that through our souls, the part of the Spirit that lives within us, we can approach God, talk with him, feel his inspiration, and come to know of God's presence in our lives. The Spirit is our closest and most direct connection to the Father. He inspires, encourages, and protects us. His providence imbues us with many gifts that help promote the good of the Church and the mission of God.

How do we come to know the Holy Spirit? The answer is simple: pray. How often do we pray for the inspiration of the Spirit? How often do we ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit? Now is our chance to come to develop a more personal relationship with the Holy Spirit and spend time in prayer and praise of the Spirit. Another way to reflect on the nature of the Holy Spirit is to reflect on passages like Jesus' Baptism, the Transfiguration, and the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Coming to know the Spirit can be challenging. Unlike the Father and the Son who show themselves in human forms, what does the Spirit look like? Does he take a human form like us? What does he feel like? What ways does he show himself? If you take time to reflect on these questions, you will come to appreciate the power of the Spirit and also the ways he works in your life.




