Did You Know ?

Ever heard of the Inquisition? How about the "office of the Inquisition"? In 1542 the Church established the Sacred Roman and Universal Inquisition to deal with heresies in Europe and the Americas. Later this would be called the Office of the Inquisitor General who oversaw issues of doctrine and heresy. The position of Inquisitor General was always from the Dominican Order until St. Pope Paul VI changed the name in 1965 of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. Both the Office of the Inquisitor General and the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith maintain the same role of adjudicating issues of faith and doctrine.




The Townsend Farmer's Market is Thursdays from 3p to 6p. It will continue every Thursday until September 29th.

Morality Part 4.2

Policing the World

As our globalized world grows more intertwined and the realities of the world settle upon us, increasing numbers of people are calling for a new world order. Namely, an increasing number of people desire a global power that can deal with atrocities like genocide, protect the rights of peoples within the sovereignty of a state's boundaries, and guide the world in such a way as to prevent wars and nuclear destruction. The question underlying these desires is, should the world have a singular power that can control the world?

Modern nations are governed by a principle called state sovereignty. Each state has the right to adjudicate and govern as the leadership deems right for the citizens of that country. Conversely, no other country has the right to violate the boundaries of a country for reasons of the internal politics of another country. Although this principle is in place, many states have justified reasons for breaking state sovereignty, i.e. genocide, political turmoil, economic gain, or liberation. The starting question is, should nations be able to police another? Can we justify breaking state sovereignty over issues of genocide, political oppression, or liberation of peoples? These seem like good reasons but they ultimately give us the justifying power to step into any political or social crisis unchallenged.

The One World Order has gained minor traction in the last several years by encouraging the world to turn to a singular governance for everyone. Either a world power like NATO, namely a conglomerate of nations, or one world governance. Given our tendency towards corruption, I argue a singular world order of this magnitude would either disintegrate into chaos or become tyrannical.

Why are both of these ideas problematic? Think of the story of the Tower of Babel. Once everyone agreed on a task and felt unified in their strength, their goal was to conquer God. The same works with the modern world. With each state controlling its own people and boundaries, the world is stable. Each country has its domain and can promote freedom and justice within its lands. No country stands above the others but countries can work together for the good of the other. Individuated countries allow charity amongst nations, the promotion of the good through social and political action, and promote identity and cultural heritage amongst people. Although idealistic, it is possible for us to govern as brothers and sisters and create a world governed by mutual care, which is the core of Pope Francis' encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*. Hence, we would police the world not through governance but by charity.
