#### Morality part 77

#### Social Ethics

#### Environmentalism

What is a proper environmental ethic as taught by the Catholic Church? Many think that the Catholic Church entered late into the dialogue regarding environmentalism. They are wrong. The idea of stewardship of our planet dates back to the Book of Genesis. Many of the theological and spiritual masters of the Middle Ages awed the world by their concern for the created world as a way of knowing God. Pope Leo XIII, writing in 1890, spent considerable time focusing on the evils of an industrialized society and its challenges for the environment and the social order. The Catholic Church has always taught that a necessary connection between our faith and the environment exists.

The first point in this ethic is the God gave us stewardship over this planet. The gift of the place we are given to live was meant to be cared for and respected. This is our home and we were commanded to care for and protect it. Eventually we will need to account before God for our actions to the gifts he has given us. In this way, our environmental ethic must examine the ways in which we used these gifts, these resources, and the gift of creation.

The second point is recognizing that creation teaches us about God and guides us to understand him. I find it fascinating that in every dystopian novel or movie the common factor is the environment is gone. God created everything and therefore everything shows God's creativity, his power, and his intellect. Without creation or by ignoring the created world and its beauty, we ignore the creator. The goal of any environmental ethic should center on the perseveration of the good of creation not simply creation on its own. We are part of creation and therefore need to see our role and the greater good of creation.

The third point is that creation is meant for our good and the progression of humanity. As Pope Leo XIII points out, the industrialization of the world is not in line with a proper environmental ethic. Using the planet for our economic gain and as a thing to be discarded once exhausted degrades that good that God created creation with and degrades our good. The created order itself is good for humanity and a good beyond economic gain. We need the planet for recreation and for our livelihood. Therefore the planet has greater worth than simply to progress humanity along the industrial track.

All three of these points must come together if we are to find a proper environmental ethic.


## Have A Seat!
