Did You Know!

The color purple with signifies the Season's of Lent and Advent was a very expensive color. The color purple was made from harvesting a specific type of sea snail. The glands from 1000's of snails were extracted, dried, crushed into powder, and then made into a dye. Since this process is incredibly labor intensive and difficult to make, only the rich could afford dyes of this color. Thus the color purple was associated with royalty giving the Seasons of Advent and Lent a royal character. A group of Italians are trying to recreate the process of creating this dye. Basics of Catholicism part 28

The Season of Lent

The church year begins with the season of Advent. Since we are past three of the seasons of the year and are now progressing through the season of Lent, I am going to start with the season of Lent to help you understand its character.

The Season of Lent was added to the church year around the 4th century. As the number of people wanted to enter the Christian church skyrocketed following the legalization of Christianity by Emperor Constantine in 313, the Church needed a way to prepare these people for entry into the Church. Prior to the legalization of Christianity, entry into the Church could take 2 to 10 years depending on the level of preparation and the person. This lengthy process was no longer possible with the incredible swell of interest. So, the church reduced the time of preparation to 40 days mirroring the many different preparatory periods of the Bible which were 40 (days/years). For these 40 days, those preparing for entry and the rest of the church would pray and fast for those about to enter the church so that they may complete their journey. Thus, Lent was formed.

The Season of Lent starts with Ash Wednesday, which is always the Wednesday before six Sundays before Easter, and ends the evening before Easter. Most people are confused by the number of days within the Season of Lent. The days of Lent are calculated as the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter minus the Sundays (6 weeks x 6 days per week + 4 days = 40 days). The Sundays are not considered part of Lent because every Sunday is a feast of the joy of the Resurrection and should therefore be days of rest and feasting.

Lent is one of the two penitential seasons of the year along with Advent. Penitential seasons are preparatory seasons that tone things down so that the celebratory seasons which follow them can be celebrated with even greater joy. For this reason, during Lent we do not sing the Gloria on Sundays. However, we continue to sing the Gloria for major feasts and other solemnities like St. Joseph and the Annunciation. Days of great joy always trump penance for fasting without feasting makes life dull and sad. We also fast from using the phrase "Alleluia." Again, by removing it from our Masses for the 40 days, it comes back with even greater joy at Easter. The color for all days of penance, including the penitential seasons, is purple. Purple was an expensive color to make and therefore only the royalty could afford it. By using the color purple, the church teaches us about the nature of this season. Lent has a royal dignity to it. Lent is a season of great importance. The darker nature of purple contrasts to the bright colors of red, green, and white that mark the other seasons. Thus, Lent takes on a somber tone with the color purple.
