Morality part 29 Sin part 3 Mortal vs Venial sin

Many people struggle with the difference between mortal and venial sin. Mortal sin is an offense that severs the relationship between God and I whereas venial sin damages it. In order for a sin to be mortal, the following conditions must be met: I. The sin must be grave matter. 2. I must have freely chosen the action. 3. I know that the sin is grave.

Let's go through these conditions in detail

The sin must be grave matter. Normally people turn to the 10 Commandments as the source of grave matter, and most of the time this is true. Most of the conditions that lead to grave matter are listed in the 10 Commandments. I think it is easier to list sins that are grave then try to describe them: worship of other Gods, using the Lord's name inappropriately, intentionally dishonoring the Sabbath, murder, adultery, pornography, sex outside of marriage, stealing, cheating, giving intentional false witness. In addition to this list, the 7 deadly vices can fit into this category as well: gluttony, anger/wrath/vengeance, sloth, pride, envy, avarice/greed, lust. Just because something is bad doesn't mean that its grave matter. Grave matter greatly harms another, oneself, or our relationship with God.

I have to know the sin is serious or mortal. Ignorance is one of the conditions that reduce the gravity of the sin from being mortal. Yet, now that I have taught you, you cannot claim ignorance. Similarly, willful ignorance is also a sin. Choosing to be ignorant of sin, its effects, or our relationship with God is sinful on its own. We should be striving to do what is right, learn God's ways, and try to conform our lives to his desires.

I have to freely choose the action. This condition causes the greatest challenge for people. We debated in seminary whether a person can ever completely, freely choose an action. Yes, we can freely choose an action. Onyone who has wrestled with a decision knows what I mean. Several conditions limit our freedom: coercion, mental and physical limitations, habits, temptations. The challenge we all face is being real with ourselves about our freedom Did I choose that action or was I forced into it? Most of the time we complied with our will more than we realize. The most common form of complicity is laziness in choosing against sin.


