### Did You Know!

The Season of Lent was added during the 4<sup>th</sup> century to accommodate the huge influx of people who wanted to join the church. Before 313, a person who wanted to join the Church could wait up to 10 years to enter the Church. The formal process took between 2 to 6 years to ensure that the person was ready to make this decision, willing to accept the challenges that come with Christianity, and wouldn't turn the Christians into the Roman government. The process was shorted to 40 days following the Edict of Constantine which became the Season of Lent. The process was expanded to 9 months in the 20<sup>th</sup> century to better prepare people for the Christian life.

# Basics of Catholicism part 25

# Redemption and Salvation Summary

As we have explored six different theories that attempt to explain Jesus' coming into the world, his death, and the effects of sin, I am sure that most of you want the correct answer to these questions. The challenge with the "correct answer" is that there are several. The fullness of our salvation and redemption has many parts each of which are necessary for understanding the whole picture and the reason why God sent his son.

The first part of understanding our redemption and salvation is about God. God wants to be with his creatures, he wants his creatures to love him, and he wants them to share in his glory forever. God created the world good and wants it to remain in the joy of that goodness. Jesus coming into the world cannot contradict this goodness or reduce God's desire to be with his creatures and bring them into his life. Therefore the first part of understanding our redemption and salvation is to know that God desires us and desired us from the beginning of creation. His plan included our salvation before the Fall.

The second part is to understand sin and its effects. Sin is any action against God's laws. Sin angers God because it destroys goodness and mars the goodness of his creation. Therefore God desires that sin be eliminated and goodness restored. God's actions in the Old Testament are great examples of this desire of God. He punishes his people to show them the effects of sin and help them choose his laws and ways. Sin needed a remedy. Goats, sheep, and bulls were not sufficient to remove the stain of sin and to transform hearts. He needed a heart that would forever take on these effects, choose God, and the choice be eternal. Thus God sent his Son to accomplish this task. No one but God can be a remedy for sin; no one but God can make a perfect eternal choice; no one but God can desire God completely and fully.

The third part requires us to understand free-will and love. Jesus' actions on the Cross, his death, and his Resurrection make no sense if we are not free to make our own choices and cannot love God in return. The gift of free-will has two important consequences. We can choose against God and thus choose sin and we can choose to love. God hoped that we would choose love of him over love of self. God hoped that his majesty and awesomeness would trump our own desires. In order for us to love, however, we needed the freedom to choose whom to love. Thus sin, death, and Jesus' death on the Cross were all consequences of our ability to choose and our choice against God.

All three of these parts are necessary for understanding Jesus' coming into the world and his actions leading to our salvation and redemption.


