# Basics of Catholicism part 9

Attributes of God

#### God as truth

Like goodness and love, truth is directly related to the other attributes of God as they build on one another and form the fullness of who God is. Recall the topic of God as all-powerful. If God could do anything he wanted, including contradict himself or change his mind, he would become a contradiction which limits his power. In the same way, if God contradicted himself or changed his ways, then he would not be true. We would always wonder at what point would he change his mind and then punish us for not following his will. Imagine that you died and went to Heaven. At the gates you meet God who tells you that you can't go to Heaven because you followed the Bible instead of the new edition of his laws that came out last year. I am sure you would be more than bummed and probably feel slighted for not having the possibility to follow God's laws. God as truth is necessary for the attributes of goodness, all-powerful, love, and eternal. God's laws persist and are true for all eternity. When God makes a decision, he cannot revoke his decision, which is a major point of the Old Testament. Hence, when God promised salvation to the Jews, he meant it not only through Jesus but also through the covenantal faithfulness of modern Jews. He cannot revoke his word or say or do anything untrue.

#### God as perfect

God cannot err, he cannot sin, he cannot do something less than perfect. This one attribute brings all the other attributes together and shows the immense goodness of God. Everything he does is without err. The other side of the perfection of God is his unity. The Greeks understood the word perfect to mean complete, entire, and whole. Thus God is perfect in the sense that he is whole and complete; he is lacking nothing.

#### God as exists

This last attribute before we move into relational characteristics of God is the easiest to understand but the one with the most implications. I can imagine a god who is perfect and has all the attributes that we want in a god. The challenge for us is that if he doesn't exist, it doesn't matter how good or perfect he is. Thus the attribute of God's existence is one of his most important attributes because it means that he exists, he is not a figment of our imagination, and we can encounter him and come to know him as something other than our imaginations.


