Did You Know!

Since the 12th century the Church has used the image of the pelican to depict Jesus. For centuries people noticed that when a parent pelican is starving and need to feed their young, the parents feed them with a red substance that looks like blood. They thought that the pelican pecked its breast until it bled and then fed their young with their blood. Turns out that when the chicks are hungry, they peck at their mother's chest to get to the fish. The imagery is still beautiful even if inaccurate: the mother feeding her chicks with her own blood is like Christ feeding us with his own blood.

Basics of Catholicism part 6

Attributes of God

I assume that many of us can name some of the attributes of God – one, all-knowing, all-present, good – but what do these attributes mean? How do they help us understand the nature of God and his relationship with us? W=We will explore these questions over the next three parts of this series.

God as one

Although this attribute is more important when we describe the Trinity and the relationship between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the "oneness" of God is more vast than simply stating that "we believe in one God." The oneness of God describes God's nature. He is simple. God is not a collection of parts like the rest of creation. We cannot take pieces from God like we could our arms or legs or leaves off a tree. God's oneness becomes a statement about his nature. God is not made of matter like the rest of us. Sometimes we describe God as having "spiritual matter." This ultimately leads to greater confusion. Instead the simplicity of God as not having matter, a shape or form, or parts should leave us in place of wonder. How can we depict a God who is so grand and great that he is unlike the rest of creation?

God as all-present

Following closely from the oneness of God, is God's all-presence also called omnipresence. We usually state the God is everywhere. This can easily be misinterpreted as though God is in everything or everywhere at once. Without a body or physical form, God can exist in any space at any time without manifesting himself in physical form. This idea is hard to grasp. We often want to describe this quality of God as part of a 4th or 5th dimension and take God out of space and time. Instead we must realize that God is unlike the rest of creation and so is not bound by the limitations of matter, space, and time. Instead he exists in all places as the being who keeps all things in existence. Some physicists have noticed that the universe behaves like a giant brain and has boundaries beyond which no matter or space exists. These findings help us grasp the universality of God but ultimately limit him to the space we can perceive. God is still greater than that. He makes everything exist, he is greater than all things that exist, we can see his handiwork in creation without God being creation, and yet he can exist in all places.

Have A Seat!


