# Basics of the Catholicism part 11

## Faith

The greatest challenge that anyone of faith or a person without faith has is coming to know God. I saw a saying years ago that brings this issue into a new light: For those who believe, no amount of proof is necessary. For those who do not believe, no amount of proof is sufficient. Although this statement makes some good points about the challenges of faith, it dismisses some very critical ones. First, people often change their beliefs, stances, or ideologies. We are human and change is a good thing. We should strive to find truth and to adhere to truth. Second, it implies that once we have set our ways, we will not change. For some people this is true. Most people, however, desire to know the truth even at the cost of being wrong. Therefore this statement helps us to see our own inclinations and challenges but also challenges us to grow.

Regardless of whether we want to admit it, we all have faith. We believe in many different things of varying degrees of truth. We believe that the sun will rise tomorrow morning because it has for billions of years. We believe that our family and friends care about us because for the most part it is true. We believe that the Earth revolves around the sun because evidence suggests it. We believe that our favorite sports team will do well this year and win their next game because we hope in them. Everyone believes in something. Even atheists believe that there is no God. Our beliefs form the fundamental structure of our person and some of our core identities. Beliefs inform the way we understand the world and engage with each other. Beliefs are critical for our ability to function as humans.

Not all beliefs are equal. Even though we use the words faith and belief interchangeably with the definition of "something not seen," beliefs are grounded in reality, in something tangible and relatable. The more a belief is grounded in reality, the truer the belief. Often people accept beliefs for simplicity sake: its easier to accept the belief than find the truth. I hope that we as people of faith find greater merit in seeking out truth, truth that comes to help us understand God. We should strive not just to accept ideas on faith but to challenge our beliefs so that we can find what is true and live it well. Faith is an essential part of who we are and correct beliefs change who we are.



# Have A Seat!

Catholic Extension is giving us a \$30,000 grant to help get new pews. There is one catch. We must match the money \$2 for every \$1 they give us. Basically we need to raise \$60,000 by Dec. 31, 2023. This may seem like a daunting or difficult task. We have raised a total of \$54,247. We have raised \$25,000 towards the Catholic Extension matching grant. We have four more months to raise an additional \$35,000. If we raise the requisite \$60,000, then we will reach our goal of \$125,000. I ask you to be generous and help us get this incredible grant.


