The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

The Gift of Fortitude

The gift of fortitude is the easiest of the virtues to understand and one of the most valuable in the spiritual life and for sanctity. Fortitude comes from the word "fort" which is a defensives structure protecting a city against invaders. With that image in mind, the gift of fortitude strengthens a person's resolve to fight evil, to strive for virtue and holiness, and to overcome laxity or lukewarmness. Often we think of fortitude with the sense of a fiery energy that endows the person with extra strength and allows them to rise to the challenge like those scenes common in sports movies. The gift of fortitude is not like that. The gift is far more subtle than the surge of energy we commonly see. Fortitude is linked with promptness, endurance, and perseverance. A person with this gift would joyfully accept their challenges with the goal of persevering in virtue and fighting against sin.

The gift of fortitude is directly linked with the virtue of fortitude and sanctity. The virtue of fortitude is a habit that we can build through virtuous living. If we choose to persevere through our challenges, desire to live well, and strive to fight against the sins in our lives, then we will grow in the virtue of fortitude. The gift of fortitude, however, is through supernatural inspiration. A person is infused with a special strength beyond their preparation and good habits giving that person the ability to overcome a special challenge, persevere through a trail, or stand firm against an aggressor. We normally see this type of infusion of grace with the martyrs. Hence, the connection of fortitude and sanctity. The ones who preserver to the end and strive to live good, holy lives show us this gift and its end goal, our salvation.



Have A Seat!

Catholic Extension is giving us a \$30,000 grant to help get new pews. There is one catch. We must match the money \$2 for every \$1 they give us. Basically we need to raise \$60,000 by Dec. 31, 2023. This may seem like a daunting or difficult task. We have already raised \$20,546 of it through donations that came after the grant was submitted.
