

Basics of Catholicism part 29

The Season of Lent

The Season of Lent has two major objectives or poles to it. The first objective is to prepare those about to enter the church, and everyone, by explaining and making clear the basic elements of the Christian life. When a person is preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil, the Church recommends that we use the Cycle A readings from Matthew on Sundays. These Gospel passages, although long, express the basic elements of Christianity. On the first Sunday of Lent we read the Temptation of Jesus in the desert with the theme of temptation and the journey of Lent. On the second Sunday of Lent we read the Transfiguration of Jesus with the principle theme of the nature of Jesus as God and man. On the third Sunday of Lent we read the Woman at the Well. Although many people assume this passage is about "living water," the point of this passage is to make clear that Jesus is the Messiah who came for all. On the fourth Sunday of Lent we read the healing of the Man born Blind. This passage reminds us that Jesus can heal and perform miracles. I think we often forget this reality. On the fifth Sunday of Lent we read the Raising of Lazareth from the Death to remind ourselves that Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life. We must keep our sights on Jesus and reminds ourselves of the reality of Heaven and Eternal Life. The final Sunday of Lent is Passion or Palm Sunday when we read the entire Passion of Jesus. Cycles B and C have similar themes as Cycle A but not as explicit as Cycle A.

The second objective of the Season of Lent is to remind us of the three themes of Lent: Fasting, Prayer, and Almsgiving. Throughout the cycle of daily readings, the ones read during daily masses, the readings focus on one of these three themes. Each of these themes are important for our daily lives. Often our lives become so busy that we forget about prayer and the necessity of speaking to God and hearing his voice. Our faith weakens the less we pray and encounter the true and living God. In a society full of food, resources, and entertainment, we can become so overwhelmed by options and daily life that we focus on the simple pleasures of life or relaxation. Fasting reminds us to focus on the things that really matter; to reorient ourselves to those things that really bring life and to simplify our lives. With so much need in the world and the constant fear of running out of money, almsgiving reminds us of a key element of the spiritual life: charity. We need to think about others and their needs. We need to give of ourselves so that we can truly be free of greed and selfish fears.

Lent is a time of simplicity and focus. We focus on the most important elements of our faith in the readings and the key themes of Lent throughout the season. Let this season be a time of encounter with God and a reprioritization.
